


When: June 22, 2026-June 28, 2026 Who: Cadettes, Seniors, Ambassadors










Girl Scout Silver Award FAQ's

- The silver award can be earned solo or in a small group
- Cadette's spend a minimum of 50 hours to complete their Silver Award
- GSSN offers Silver Award training opportunities for girls quarterly



A Girl Scout who earns a Gold Award:

- · Expands her resume and distinguishes herself among other college applicants
- Enters the U.S. Armed Forces one rank higher
- May apply for scholarships that universities and colleges offer to Gold Award recipients
- May apply for the Crutchfield Healy Scholarship & GSUSA Gold Award Scholarship
- Over one million girls have earned their Gold Award or equivalent since 1916



How to Register for Programs

- Locate the program you want to register for on the GSSN calendar gssn.org/activities
- Log into your myGS account at mygs.girlscouts.org/my-account
- If you already have an account: Sign in using the email address we have on file. If you don't remember your password, click the "Forgot my password" link with instructions on how to reset your password.
- If you don't have an account: Click on Create an Account and follow the instructions.
- Note: You can pay for a program using your gsBucks or Juliette Funds. To use, please email Customer Care at girlscoutshelp@gssn.org and they will process the registration for you.
- Programs are subject to change per staff availability or girl interest.
- Be mindful of registration deadlines these can be up to three weeks prior to the event. Some programs have minimum registration requirements that must be met for the program to run and may be subject to cancellation if not enough people register before the deadline.

Confirmation Notices

- Confirmations will be sent from the program lead to the email on file for the registered adult (parent/caregiver of the girl) with program details the week of the program. Please confirm we have the correct email on file when registering for programs.
- You can view all program registrations by logging in to your myGS account under the My Events tab. This will list all the programs you have registered for and the payment status
- For virtual programs or webinars, you will receive the log-in information approximately 24 hours prior to the event.

Cancellations/Refunds

- Cancellations received after the registration deadline are not eligible for a refund or transfer of event fees.
- If GSSN cancels a program, a full refund will be made available.
- Please contact customer care at girlscoutshelp@gssn.org if you need to cancel a program registration.



Troop Year Planner

Age-appropriate troop year plans are the best tool for first year troop leaders to get started with Girl Scouts without getting overwhelmed. The entire year is mapped out—just follow along to help your Girl Scouts complete badge activities, improve their communities, and explore the world around them.







Traditions

Girl Scout Sign: Raising three fingers of the right hand with the thumb holding down the pinky. The three fingers represent the three parts of the Girl Scout Promise.

Motto: The Girl Scout motto is "Be prepared."

Slogan: The Girl Scout slogan is "Do a good turn daily."

Girl Scout Handshake: Girl Scouts can greet one another using the left handed handshake. This handshake is used by Girl Scouts & Girl Guides around the world.

Friendship Circle: Represents the unbroken chain of friendship among Girl Scouts & Girl Guides around the world.

Girl Scout Days

Juliette Gordon Low's birthday, October 31, marks the birth in 1860 of Girl Scouts of the USA founder.

World Thinking Day, February 22, is a day of international friendship and a time where Girl Scouts and Girl Guides learn about the lives of girls around the globe.

Girl Scouts' birthday, March 12, commemorates the day in 1912 when Juliette Gordon Low officially registered the organization's first 18 members in Savannah, Georgia.

Girl Scout Week is celebrated each March, starting with Girl Scout Sunday and ending with Girl Scout Sabbath.

Girl Scout Leader's Day, April 22, honors all the volunteers who work as leaders and mentors in partnership with girls. On this day, Girl Scouts, their families, and their communities find special ways to thank their Girl Scout volunteers.

<u>Ceremonies</u>

Opening ceremonies can kick off regular Girl Scout meetings and make them feel special!

Bridging marks a girl's move from one level of Girl Scouting to another.

Rededication ceremonies are an opportunity for Girl Scouts, their families, and volunteers to renew their commitment to the Girl Scout Promise and Law.

A Fly-Up is a bridging ceremony for Girl Scout Brownies bridging to Girl Scout Juniors.

An Investiture welcomes new members into the Girl Scout family for the first time.

A Court of Awards ceremony honors Girl Scouts' accomplishments.

Flag ceremonies can be part of any activity that honors the American flag.



SWAPS stands for:

"Special Whatchamacallits Affectionately Pinned Somewhere."

They are small tokens of friendship that Girl Scouts exchange with one another, and each SWAP uniquely reflects a fellow Girl Scout, their troop, or a memory of a special event. They're a great way to share stories and get to know Girl Scouts from across the country and the world.

Council-Led Troops FAQ's

Q: What is a council-led troop (CLT)?

A: A CLT is a Girl Scout troop that is led by council staff. We don't have enough volunteers to fill the need of the troop leader role, so we have stepped in to ensure that every girl that wants to can join Girl Scouts at GSSN. CLT's meet up to twice per month, September through May. They take the summer months off from regular troop meetings to have field trips or participate in other summer activities.

Q: Who pays for this?

A: Families pay a troop fee of \$150 in addition to the annual membership fee and council service fee of \$70. The \$150 covers the cost of uniforms, patches, staffing, and meeting supplies for the school year. This would be the equivalent to "troop dues" in a volunteer-led troop.

Q: How does the cookie program work for CLT's?

A: Girls in CLT's participate in the cookie program just as a girl in a Volunteer-Led Troop would. Cookie booths are staffed by our CLT staff or parent volunteers. CLT's use these funds to help offset costs of the program that exceed the \$150 troop fee in addition to going on summer field trips using their cookie proceeds. This past summer our older CLT girls went to Six Flags and our younger CLT girls had a day at Lake Tahoe.

Q: How is a CLT "girl-led"?

A: Girls in our CLT program take an end of year survey to decide what badges they want to work on the following year. Girls are given "kapers" or an assigned task at each meeting to ensure that every troop meeting is girl-led.

Q: What do girls do in a CLT?

A: Our CLT girls work on badges, patches, and higher awards just as a volunteer-led troop would. They have the opportunity to register and participate in any council hosted program on our calendar. Below is the CLT schedule for MY26:

CLT Pro's

- the financial responsibility off of the troop. Council manages the troop funds between the Finance & CLT • The troop leader may be a different staff member at Departments.
- CLT troop plans are set by our Girl Experience Team. This ensures that all girls are receiving an equitable and high quality Girl Scout experience.
- CLT staff are required to be background checked, fingerprinted, & take all required trainings ensuring that our troops are managed safely.

CLT Con's

- A CLT does not have a troop bank account. This takes The year plan is set in advance and there is not much room for change.
 - some meetings depending on availability.
 - Some curriculum is determined by grants and out of our control.
 - CLT's receive half the cookie proceeds than a VLT does to cover the cost of staffing the CLT cookie program.
 - A CLT will have fewer field trip opportunities than a volunteer-led troop due to funding.
