

Camp Wasiu II

GSSN's Camp Wasiu II provides girls in grades 1 to 12, with girl-led programming through outdoor overnight experiences. Each year, our camp program grows, providing more

leadership opportunities and outdoor experiences for girls from Northern Nevada and Northeastern California. This year, 555 campers attended Camp Wasiu II, a 31 percent increase from summer 2016!
