Powering Amazing Experiences

The Girl Scout Cookie Program is the largest girl-run financial literacy program in the world. Through the program, Girl Scouts learn and practice five essential financial literacy skills:

- Money Management
- · Goal Setting
- Decision Making
- · Business Ethics
- People Skills

1,876 Girl Scouts participated in the Girl Scout Cookie Program in 2020, selling delicious cookies customers ask for by name. Many Girl Scouts also donated boxes of cookies through the Gift of Caring program to several local nonprofit organizations, such as Blue Star Mothers of Sierra Nevada, Children's Cabinet of Nevada, Ronald McDonald House, and the Food Bank of Northern Nevada. Through immersive workshops such as Cookie Captains, Cookie CEO, Cookie Rookies, and Cookie University, Girl Scouts across our council were well-prepared for a successful cookie season.

Pivot to Virtual

When all in-person activities and troop meetings were cancelled in mid-March, Girl Scouts of the Sierra Nevada and GSUSA pivoted to provide 100% of its programming online. We quickly started a "Girl Scout at Home" program and made much of our Girl Scout programming available to not just registered Girl Scouts, but any girl.

Throughout the spring and summer, we re-imagined girl programming. Utilizing Zoom, YouTube and Facebook, we created badge workshops, uploaded video tutorials on fun craft and service project ideas, developed and executed a "100 Years of Suffrage" patch program, hosted online sing-alongs, posted at-home challenges, and even developed a week-long virtual camp experience. We provided coaching and how-to Zoom classes for our volunteer Troop Leaders, along with encouragement that they CAN keep girls engaged and connected while social distancing and staying safe.

We are incredibly proud and grateful for the work of our volunteers, and the GSSN staff, in making sure that Girl Scout Leadership not only survived, but thrived, despite the obstacles that arose in 2020.

Fun with Purpose

Girl Scouts of the Sierra Nevada (GSSN) introduces Girl Scouts of every age to science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) to help them see how they can improve the world. Our goal through our "fun with purpose" K-12 STEM curriculum is for every girl to explore different aspects of STEM and to inspire girls to embrace and celebrate scientific discovery in their lives.

42 NEW STEM badges and one new Journey were released, allowing Girl Scouts to explore cybersecurity, outdoor adventure, space science, and coding.

GSSN introduced the Women's Suffrage Centennial Patch Program to commemorate Nevada's ratification and national adoption of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution. This GSSN council patch program was a huge success! We had 556 girls participate. This program was sponsored by the League of Women Voters of Northern Nevada.

Camp In Camp Out

One of our most popular activities of the year, Girl Scout Camp, was reimagined as the "Girl Scout Camp In Camp Out." This weeklong event utilized multiple online platforms like YouTube and live Facebook events, along with take-home kits that encouraged girls to get outside and look at the stars, identify flora and fauna in their neighborhoods and practice important skills, like setting up a tent in their backyard and assembling a survival kit.

Complete with opening and closing campfires (via YouTube), silly songs and skits, GSSN staff worked hard to keep 285 virtual campers having fun and, most importantly learning, during the long summer of social distancing.





All That Glitters Girl Scouts Highest Awards

Girl Scouts is the only place where girls can earn the Gold Award - one of the most prestigious awards for girls in the world!

Earning a Girl Scout Gold Award is a great boost when it comes to applying for college and scholarships, establishing a lifetime network, and so much more! Younger girls can also complete their Bronze and Silver awards - and this year, our council had 44 Girl Scouts earn Bronze Awards and 33 Girl Scouts earned their Silver Award. All three awards give girls the chance to make powerful, lasting change in their community while working on an issue that has captured their interest in a big way.
