This year was tough, but the Sierra Nevada Girl Scouts Council was tougher. Our members, volunteers and staff navigated a difficult environment with grace and creativity. Although COVID continued to have huge impacts on our daily lives, we found creative ways to gather, to experience the out of doors, and to reengage our girls in an ever-changing environment

Safely selling cookies in a pandemic is tough, but our Girl Scouts were tougher. They found ways to create and execute on their individual business plans, utilizing the internet, mobile delivery services, imaginative social media and email advertising and just flat-out hard work.

Participating in STEM programing in a pandemic was tough, but our Girl Scouts were tougher. They found creative ways to meet virtually, to meet safely in person, and to engage in new, stimulating, and groundbreaking science, technology, engineering and math projects, from working on the new Mining Patch funded by the Nevada Mining Association to building solar ovens in which to bake s'mores.

Getting involved in the outdoors and meeting new outdoor challenges in a pandemic is tough, but our Girl Scouts are tougher. They participated in our first ever Adventure Club, with activities ranging from rock climbing to snowshoeing to hiking the Tahoe Rim Trail. They participated in Day Camps held throughout our region, from Elko to Tahoe. They learned to fly fish, to white water raft, to camp in our gorgeous outdoor environments and had so many other exciting experiences. And they did it safely and in a way that supported new learnings, new activities and personal security.

Fundraising in a pandemic is tough, but our Fund Development staff and our amazing supporters are tougher. The pandemic caused several of our traditional fundraising events to be cancelled, but we were able to pivot and rely on creative events like Cookies on Tap and Cookies and Wine. We also hosted our first virtual fundraiser. "The Power of Girl," Thank you to our amazing donors for continuing your support of our council. Without you, we could not have remained in business.

## Girl Scout Cookie Program

The Girl Scout Cookie Program is the largest girl-run financial literacy program in the world. The 2021 Cookie Kickoff for GSSN was sponsored by U.S. Bank and held virtually. During kickoff, and throughout the program, each Girl Scout learned and practiced five essential financial literacy skills:

- Money Management
- Goal Setting
- Decision Making
- Business Ethics
- People Skills

1,060 Girl Scouts participated in the Girl Scout Cookie Program in 2021, selling delicious cookies customers ask for by name like Thin Mints, Lemonades, Caramel deLites and the new Toast-Yay. Many Girl Scouts also donated boxes of cookies through the Gift of Caring program to several local nonprofit organizations all over northern Nevada and northeastern California including, but not limited to: Food Bank of Northern Nevada, Meals on Wheels throughout northern Nevada, Project 150, Blue Star Moms, Ronald McDonald Houses, and smaller food banks. In total, 4,140 boxes of cookies were donated to nonprofit organizations.



## Fall Product Program

Everyone knows Girl Scouts sell cookies in the winter, but not everyone knows they also sell nuts, chocolate, and magazines in the fall. This is predominantly a sale to friends and families and Nut & Candy delivery comes at the perfect time for holiday giving. The products make thoughtful gifts for teachers, bus drivers, and postal workers.

Our Fall Product Sale gives troops a chance to earn startup money without having to wait until cookie season. The troops can use the funds they earn to enjoy new and exciting opportunities right away.

This year's Fall Product Program mascot was Chilly the Penguin and, in keeping with the spirit of Chilly's home terrain, GSSN kicked off the Fall Product Program with an afternoon of ice skating. Over 100 Girl Scouts took to the ice at this joyful event and 324 participated in the sale.

## Fun with Purpose

Girl Scouts of the Sierra Nevada introduces Girl Scouts of every age to science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) to help them see how they can improve the world. Our goals through our "fun with purpose" K-12 STEM curriculum are for every girl to explore different aspects of STEM and to inspire girls to embrace and celebrate scientific discovery in their lives.

Our **Mining in Today's World Patch Program**, designed in collaboration with, and through a genererous grant from the **Nevada Mining Association**, explores all areas of the mining industry and the impact mining has in today's world. The program has an overarching goal of inspiring girls to consider a career in mining-related industries. The activities for the Mining in Today's World Patch Program are age-specific so that all Girl Scouts who are Daisies through Ambassadors can participate in this special opportunity. To date, over 700 Girl Scouts have particpated in the Mining in Today's World Patch Program!

## Making a Difference

A major focus of the DEI Department is serving low-income and Outreach Troops. Families living in a low socioeconomic status struggle with poverty-related barriers that can prevent girls from participating in Girl Scouts. In these communities, where appointing volunteers can be difficult, Girl Scouts of the Sierra Nevada provides leadership opportunities for girls by utilizing trained program staff (program leaders). Council program leaders foster healthy long-term relationships with the girls whom they see at troop meetings and provide mentorship and Girl Scouting opportunities.

The DEI Program partners with several organizations in the community to better identify low-income areas, including Washoe County School District - 21st Century Schools, Boys & Girls Club of the Truckee Meadows, Boys & Girls Club of Western Nevada, Communities in Schools, City of Reno, Truckee Meadows Parks Foundation, Volunteers of America Family Homeless Shelter, the Reno Housing Authority, Food Bank of Northern Nevada, and several Section 8 subsidized housing areas.







## Wasiu on the Road

Due to COVID and other challenges, our beloved resident camp near Sierra City, Camp Wasiu II, was unable to open in the summer of 2021. That road bump was not able to slow us down from spreading some camp magic. We started our first year of "Wasiu on the Road."

This new model of camp allowed us to bring camp staff, traditions, and programming to our Girl Scouts in Quincy, Tahoe, Susanville, Reno, and Elko, reaching many girls who may not have been able to attend camp otherwise. We received great feedback from girls and parents, and we look forward to improving on and growing our traveling day camp program in the years to come.

## Outdoor Adventures

This year, while members slowly began to return to in person meetings, our outdoor programs had a chance to shine. We also added new opportunities for the girls to improve their outdoor skills, such as fly fishing, rock hounding, and winter wilderness survival.
